Articulation arrangements with the University of Notre Dame, Sydney for entry into the Bachelor of Commerce and Bachelor of Marketing and Public Relations Degree Programs.

Students who have completed the Advanced Diploma of Hospitality and the Advanced Diploma of Events may be eligible for advanced standing in the following units:

The Hotel School, Southern Cross University

Articulation with The Hotel School, Sydney, Southern Cross University for entry into the Bachelor of Business in Hotel Management

Under this arrangement, a student who has completed the Advanced Diploma of Hospitality and/or the Advanced Diploma of Events is guaranteed 1.5 years of credit towards the **Bachelor of Business in Hotel Management** (http://sydney.hotelschool.scu.edu.au/degrees/bachelor-business-hotel-management).

This is equivalent to 144 credit points of the 288 total credit points required for completion of the Degree.

Oxford Brookes University, UK

Articulation with Oxford Brookes Department of Hospitality, Leisure and Tourism Management for entry into the Bachelor in Hotel and Restaurant Management or Bachelor in International Hospitality Management.

Currently under review but is expected to grant at least 1.5 years credit for these programs to students who have completed both Advanced Diplomas at Kenvale.
